Both rising actors and singers, the couple met in the tumult of 1968 at the American Music & Dramatic Academy (AMDA) in NYC. "On the very first day of school, I saw him walk by and my heart sang," smiles Anne. Their courtship was inevitable. But, after the sudden loss of Anne's father and the deep grief that followed, Anne and Rich went their separate ways. 45 years later, when Anne heard that Rich's wife had passed, she sent him a condolence card and he reached out to say thank you. "We began chatting and despite still grieving for my wife, I realized that the more I was in touch with Anne, the better I felt," remembers Rich. Their first date, after over four decades apart, was just after Valentine's Day. "It was like 45 years never even happened," Rich explained, "when our eyes met, it was soul to soul. I was still in a state of grief but realized I was also falling in love simultaneously!" Three dates later, they decided to get married! This year, the couple will celebrate their ten-year wedding anniversary.

Anne Tarpey-Flanders was born in Greenwich Village, NYC and raised in Eastchester, NY with one younger brother. She had considered following her dad's footsteps as a doctor but instead majored in psychology at the College of Mount Saint Vincent where she also discovered the joy of performing in plays and musicals. After graduation, Anne enrolled at

AMDA, a full-time two-year arts academy in NYC. "Of course, this is where I met Rich. He had me at the first song! We were poor struggling actors at the time but a big romance was brewing and he saved enough money to take me out to lunch. We began dating soon after." As Anne reflects on this first chapter of their love story, both of their hearts were broken when they went their separate ways.



Rich went on to become an accomplished actor and singer, appearing in 'Shenandoah' on Broadway and the first national Broadway tour of 'Annie.' He also started working for the Shaklee Corporation, distributing health & nutrition products and met and married his first wife, Amy, He kept performing, singing with various groups, and recording. His first album, 'Yondering,' won The Will Rogers Cowboy Award, "When my wife died suddenly. Anne was not on my radar. I was in a state of grief.
